Inland Empire- Transportation Hub Since 1775



In 1776, while American patriots fought for their independence from England, Spanish Lt. Colonel Juan Bautista de Anza led more than 240 men, women, and children some 1,800 miles to establish a settlement at San Francisco Bay.

These families were the first colonists to come overland across the frontier of New Spain into present-day California.

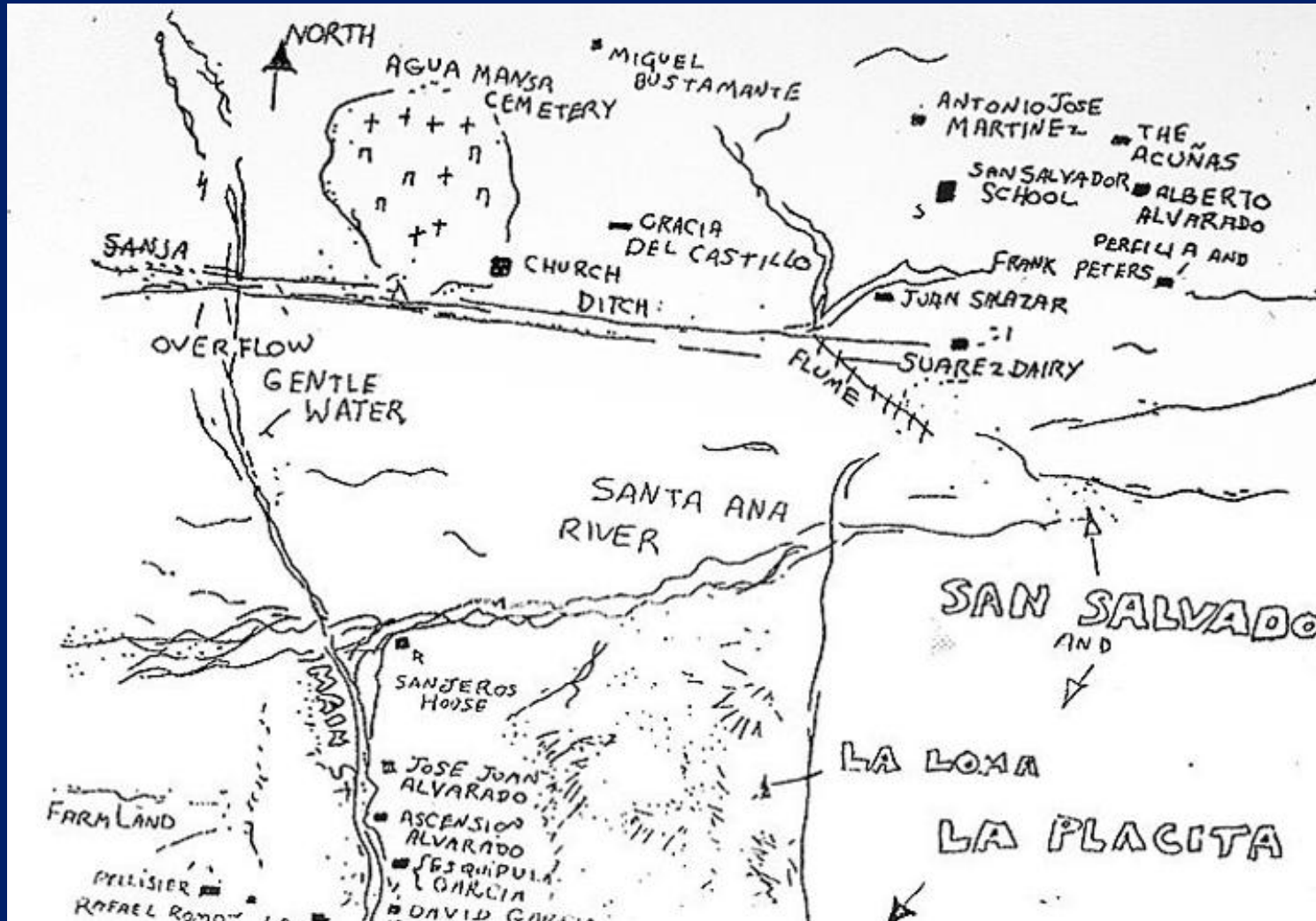

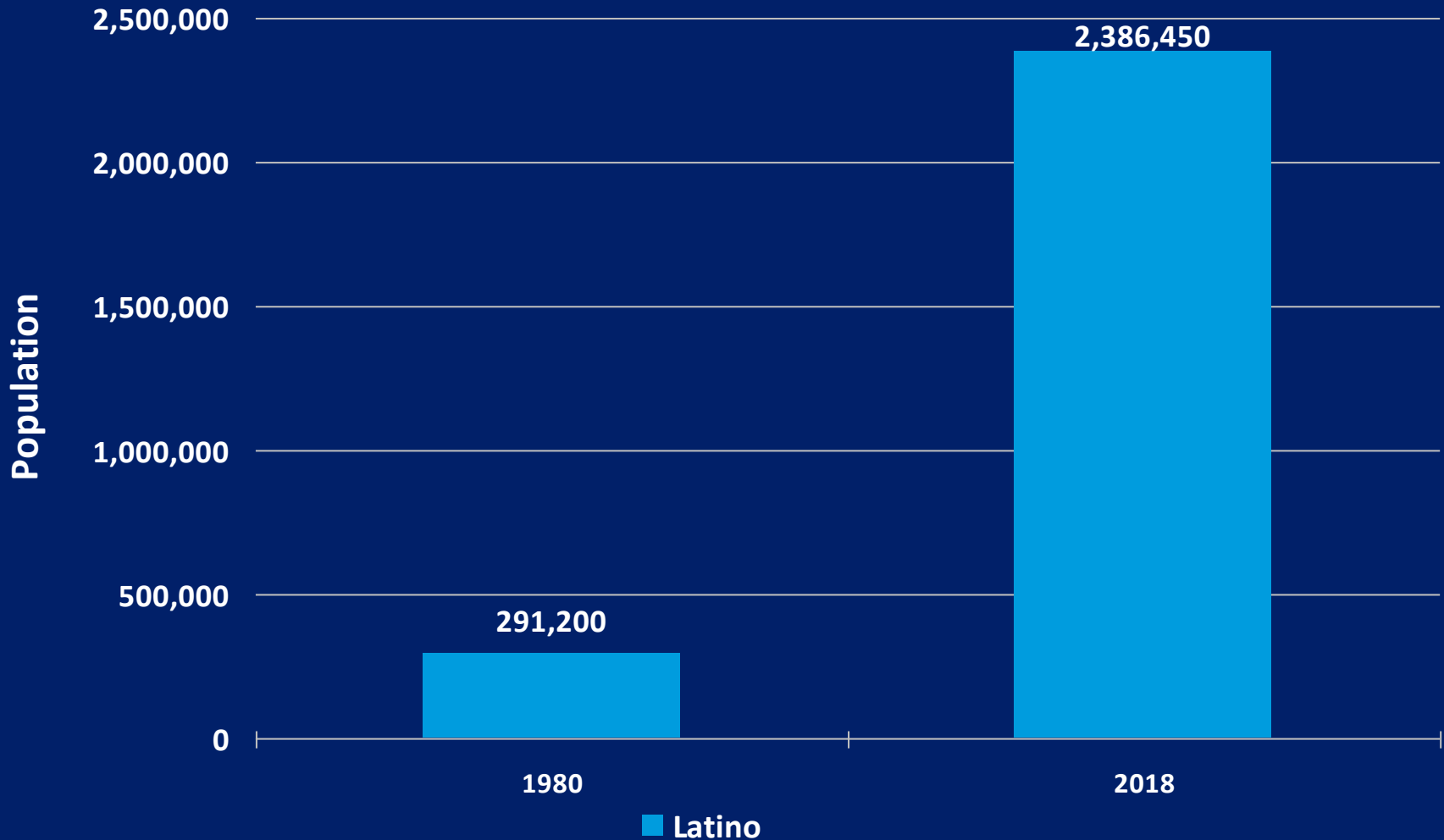

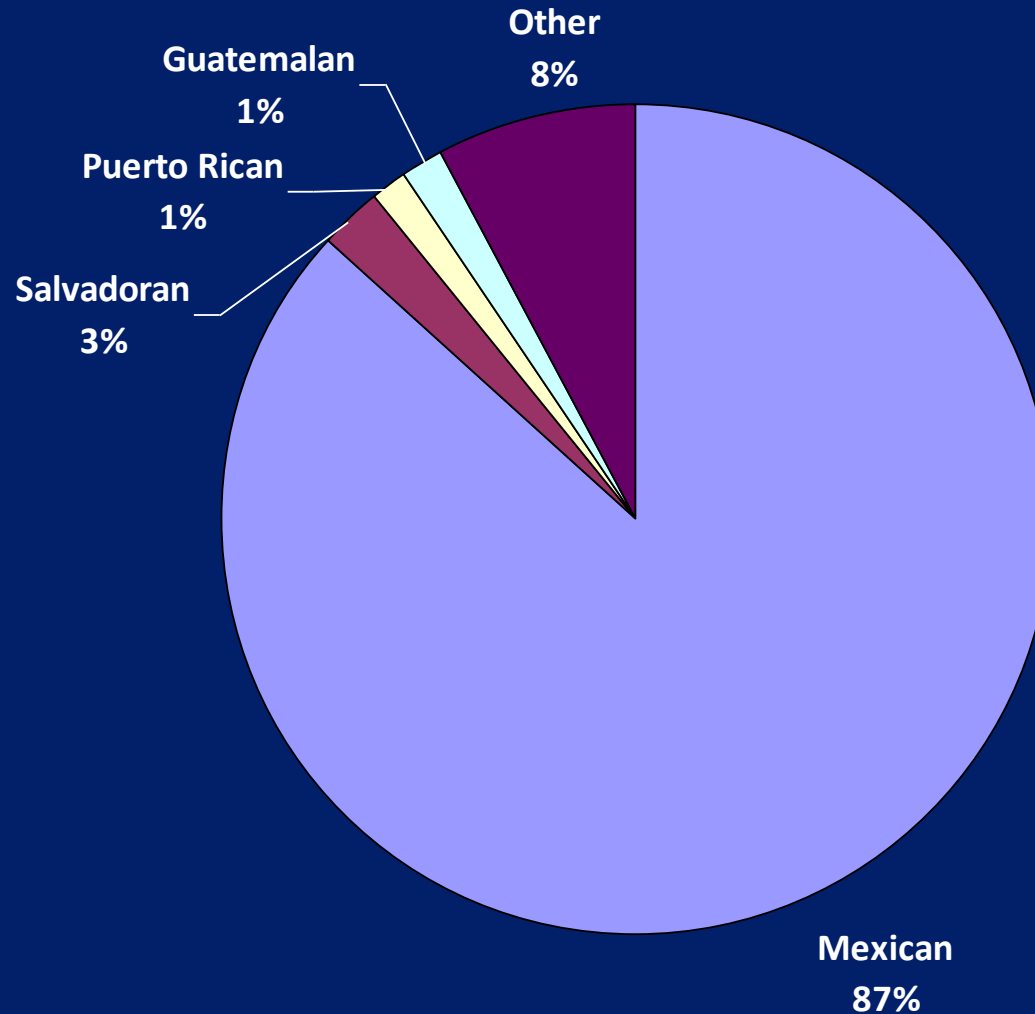

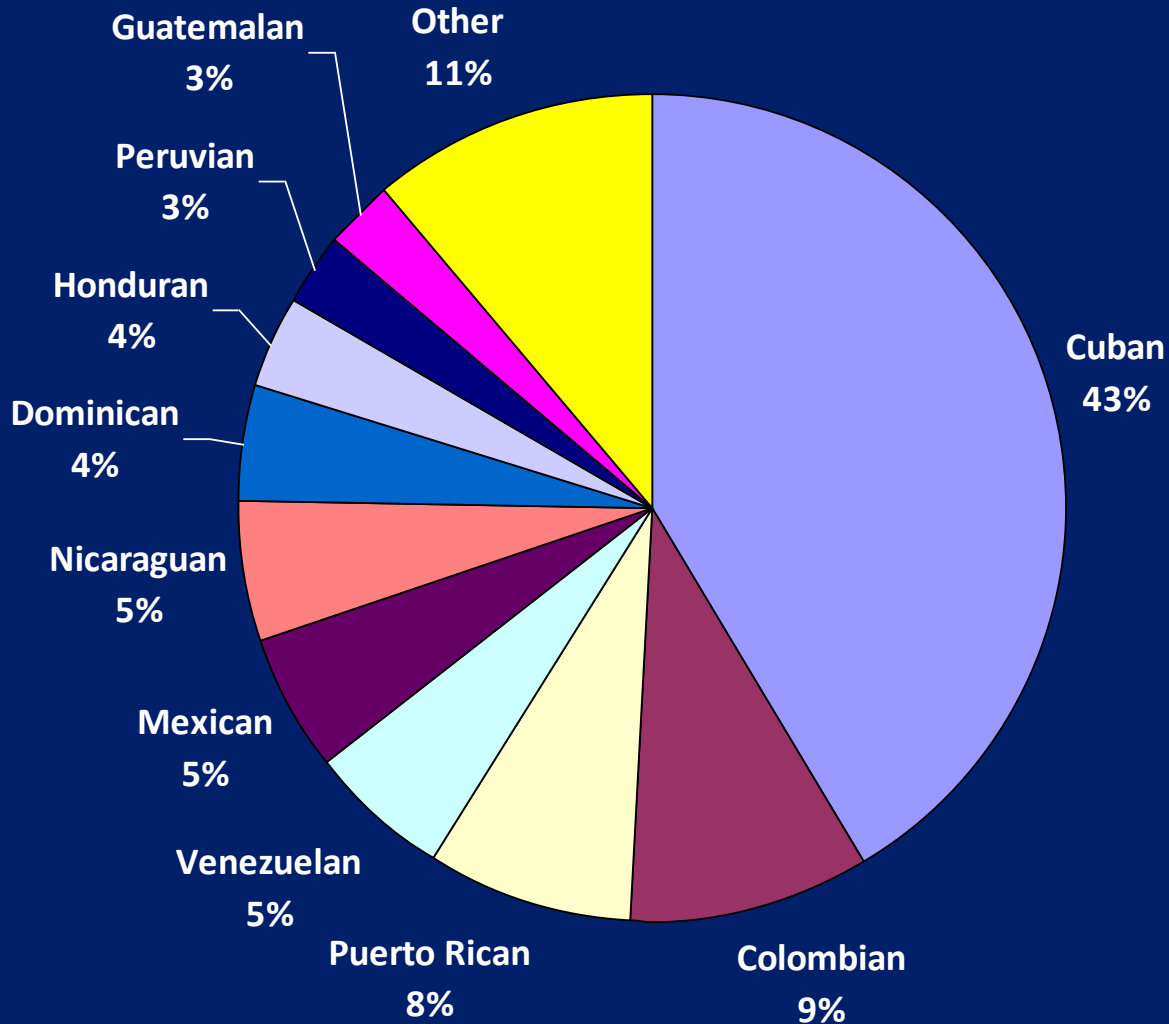

Latino National Origin, MIA Metro 2018

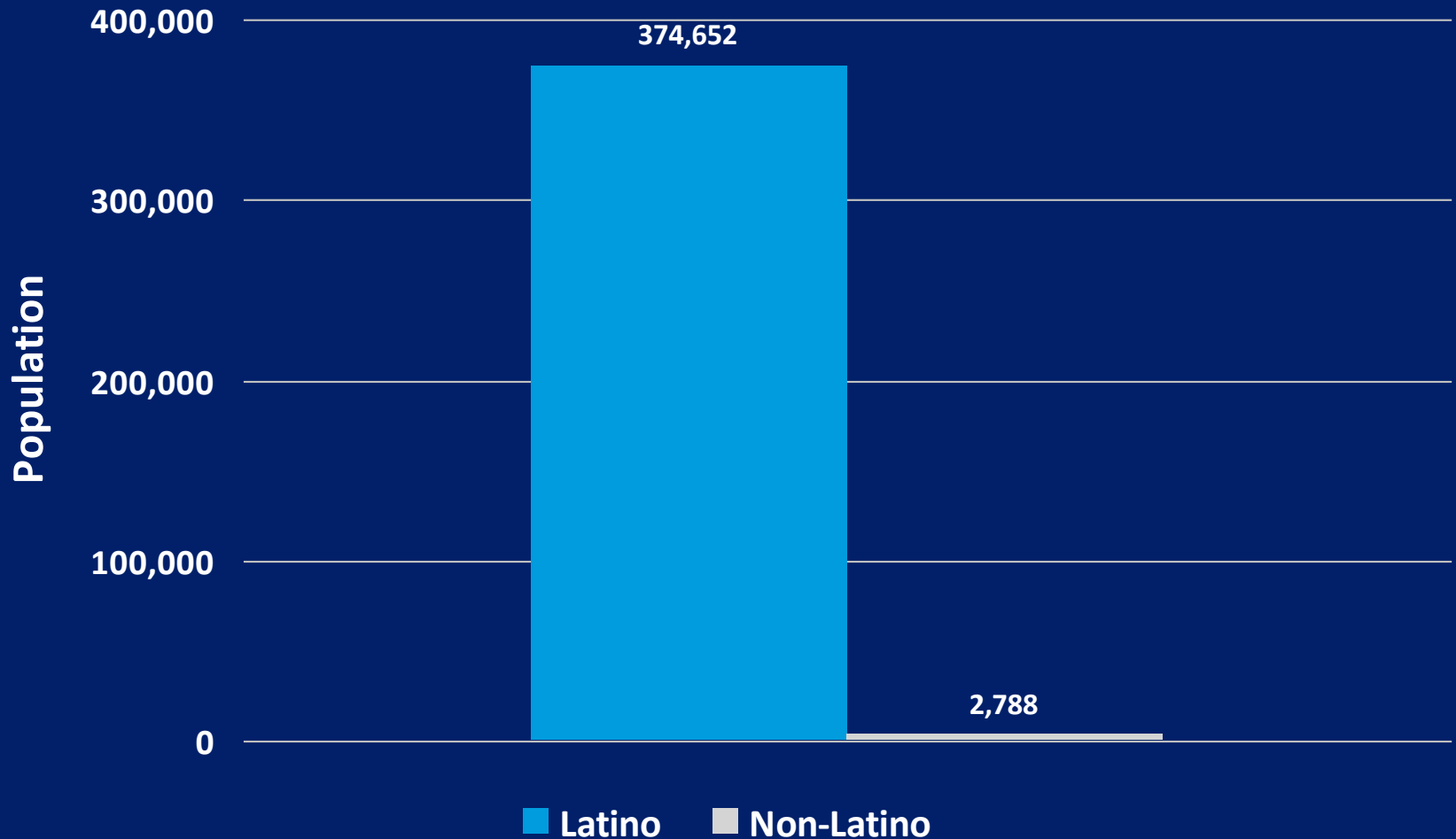

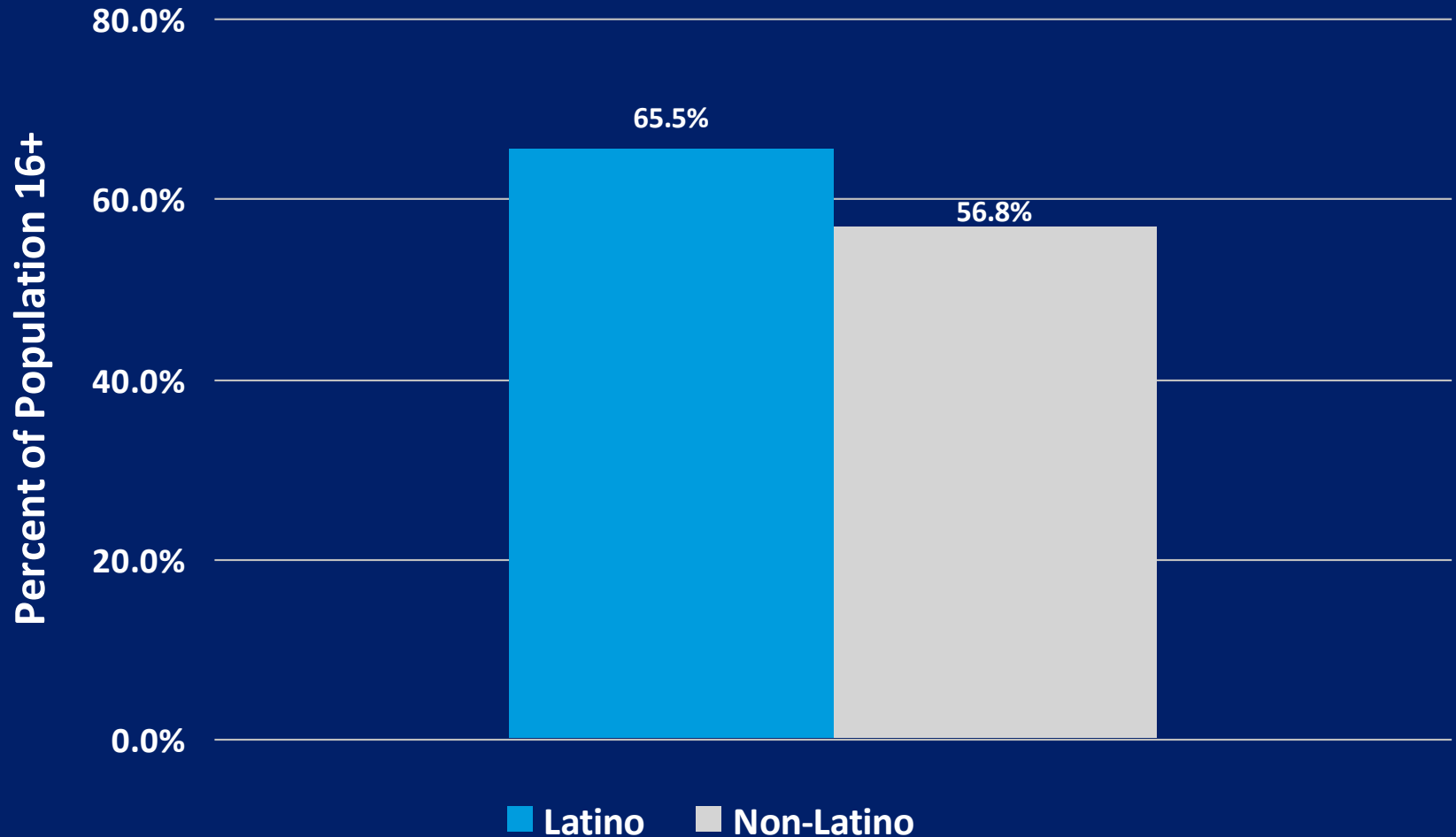

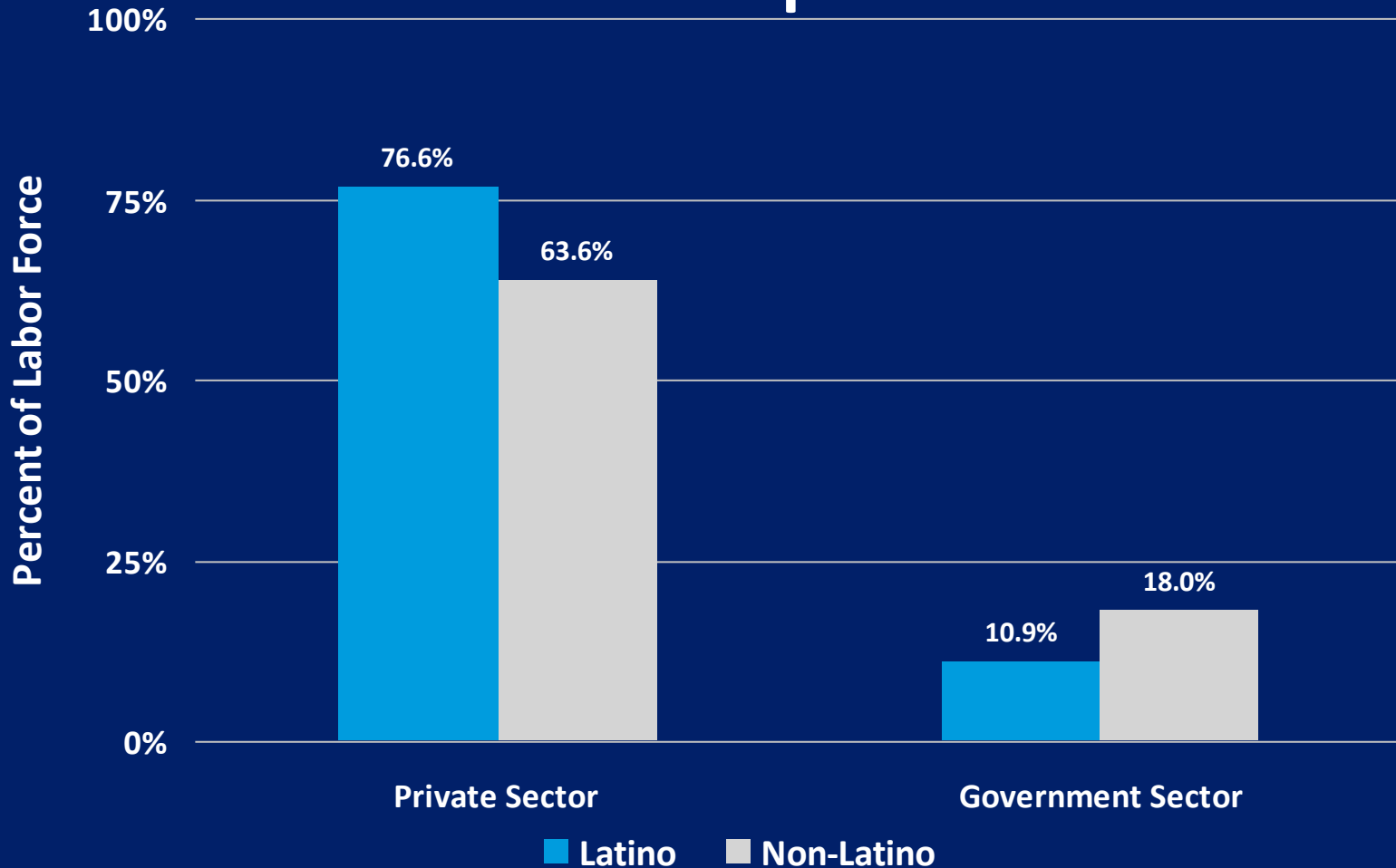
Latino Population Change, Inland Empire 2010-2018



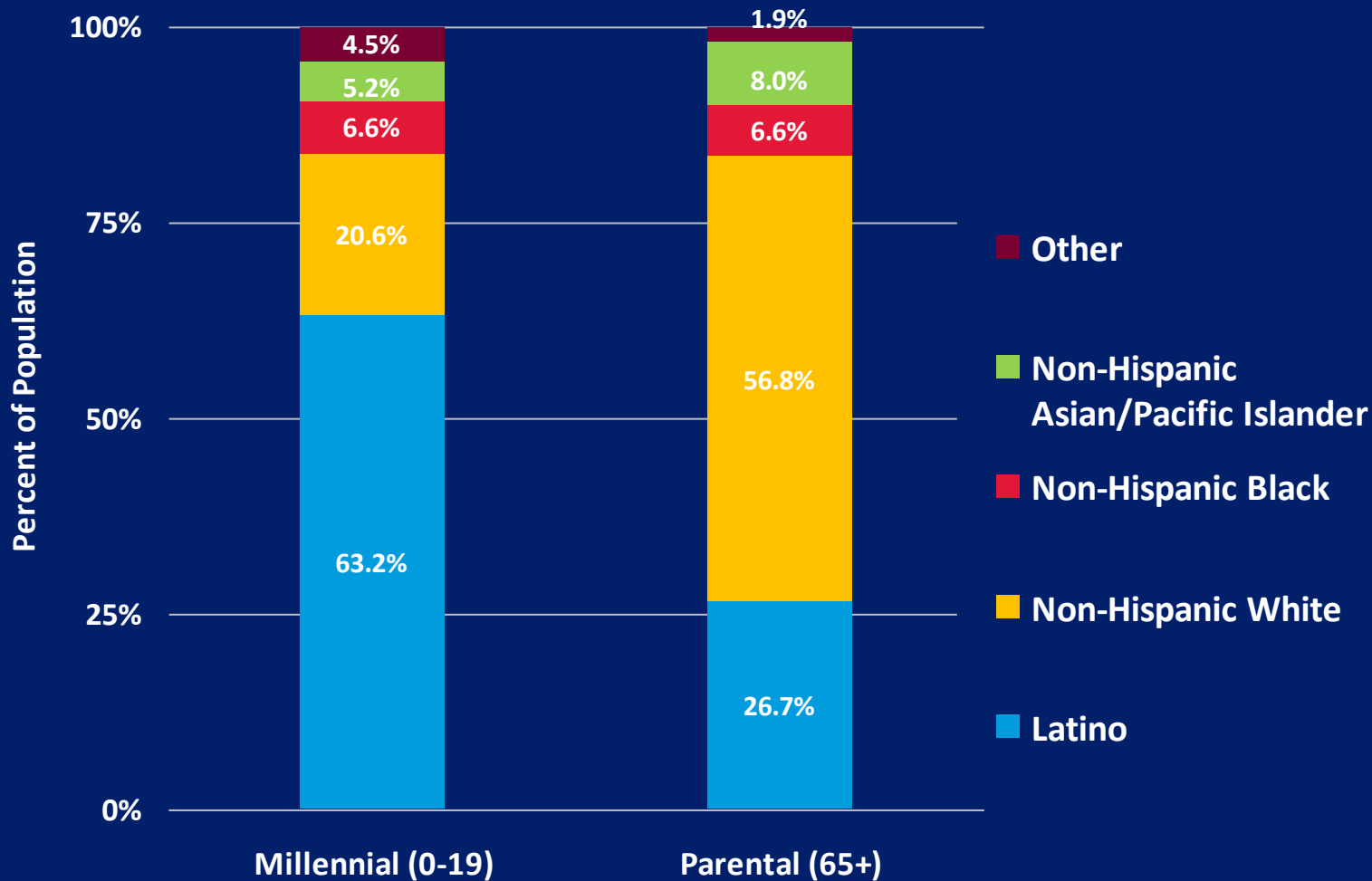
Latino Labor Force Participation, Inland Empire 2018



Self-Sufficiency – Private and Government Sector Employment, Latino and Non-Latino, Inland Empire 2018



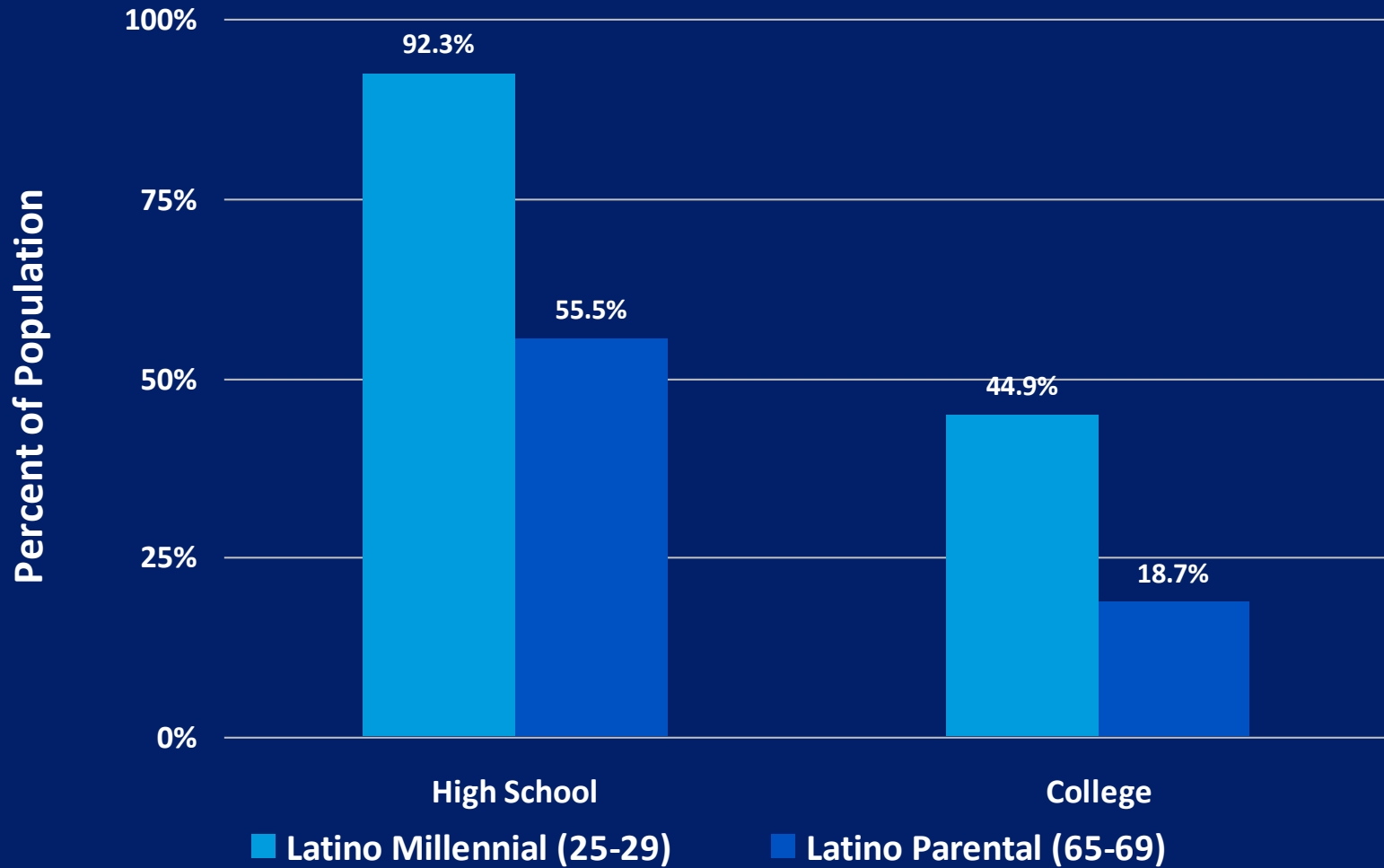
Millennial and Parental Age, By Race/Ethnicity, Inland Empire 2018



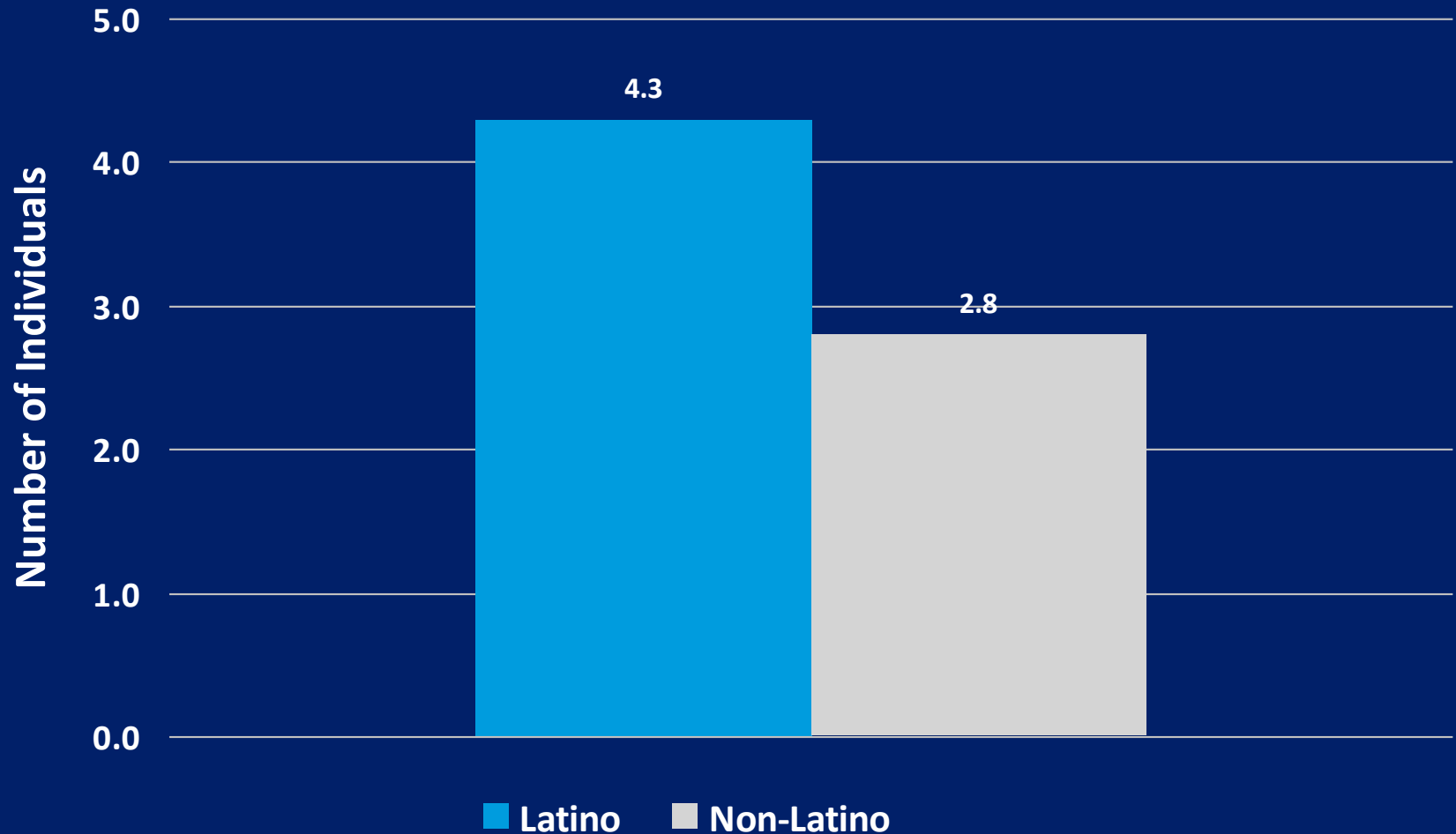
Educational Increase, Latino Millennials over Latino Parental Generation, Inland Empire 2018

Latino High School and College Attendance, Millennial and Parental Generation, Inland Empire 2018



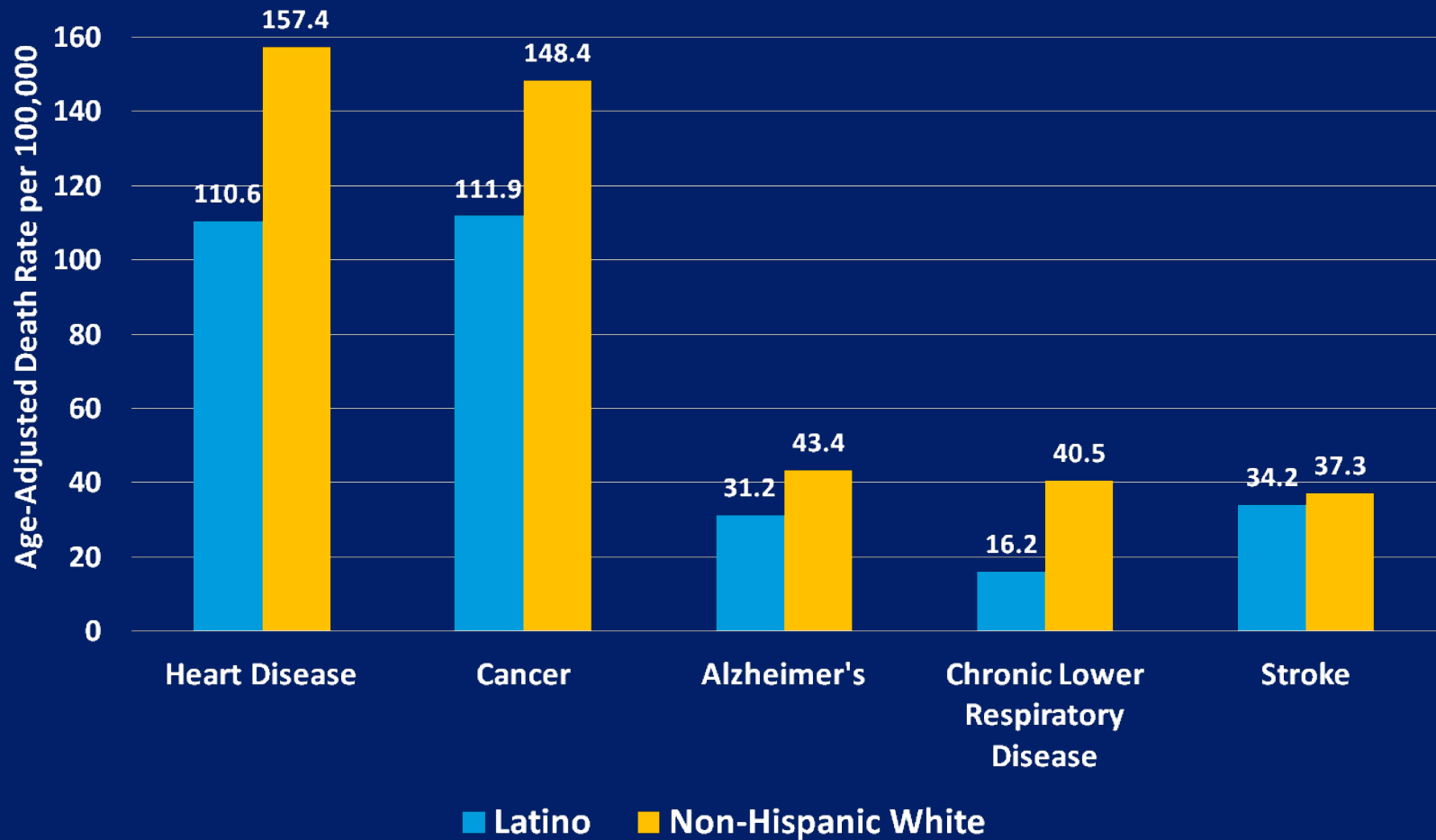
Average Household Size, Latino and Non-Latino Inland Empire 2018

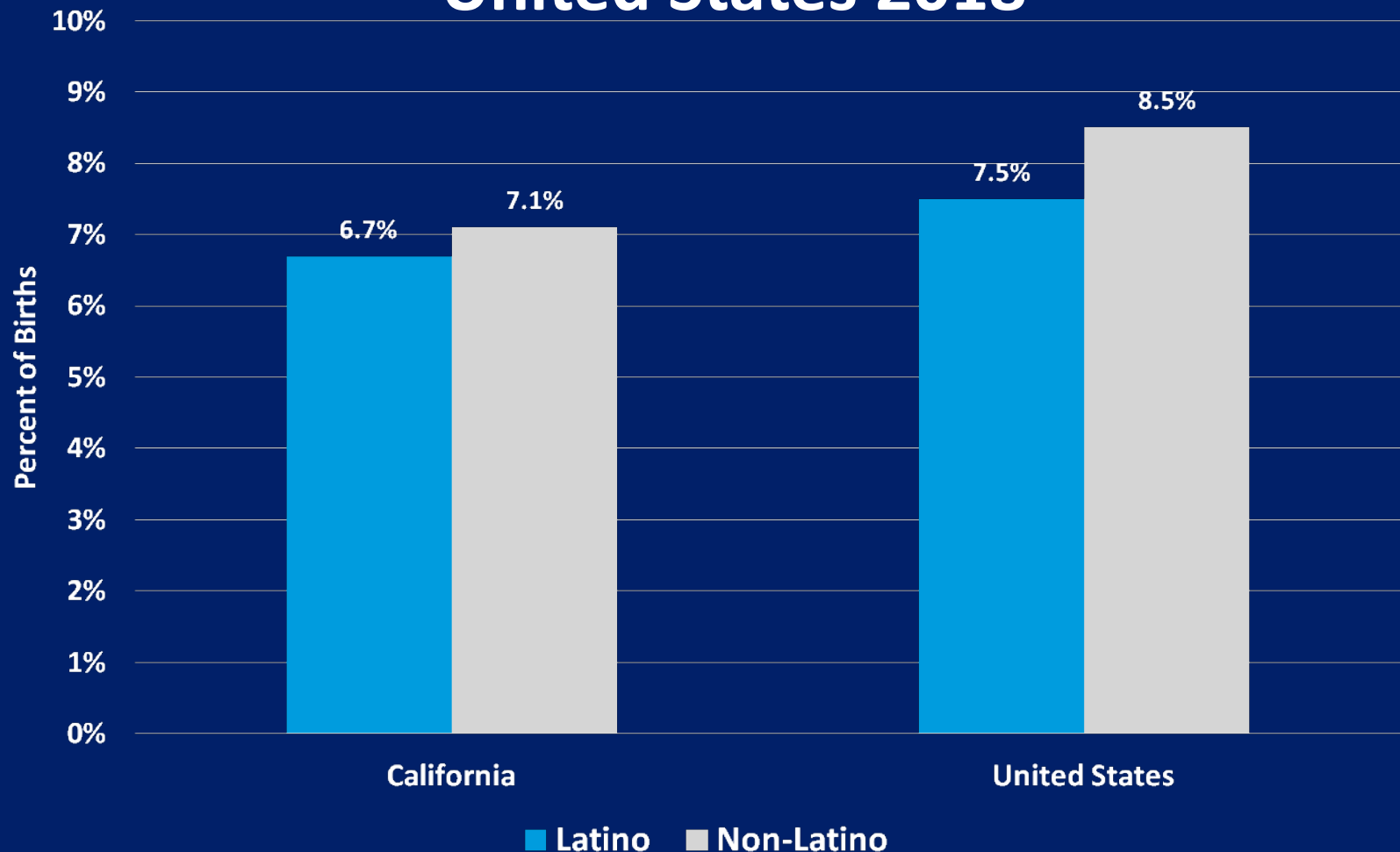
Age-Adjusted Death Rates, Latino and Non-Hispanic White, California 2018

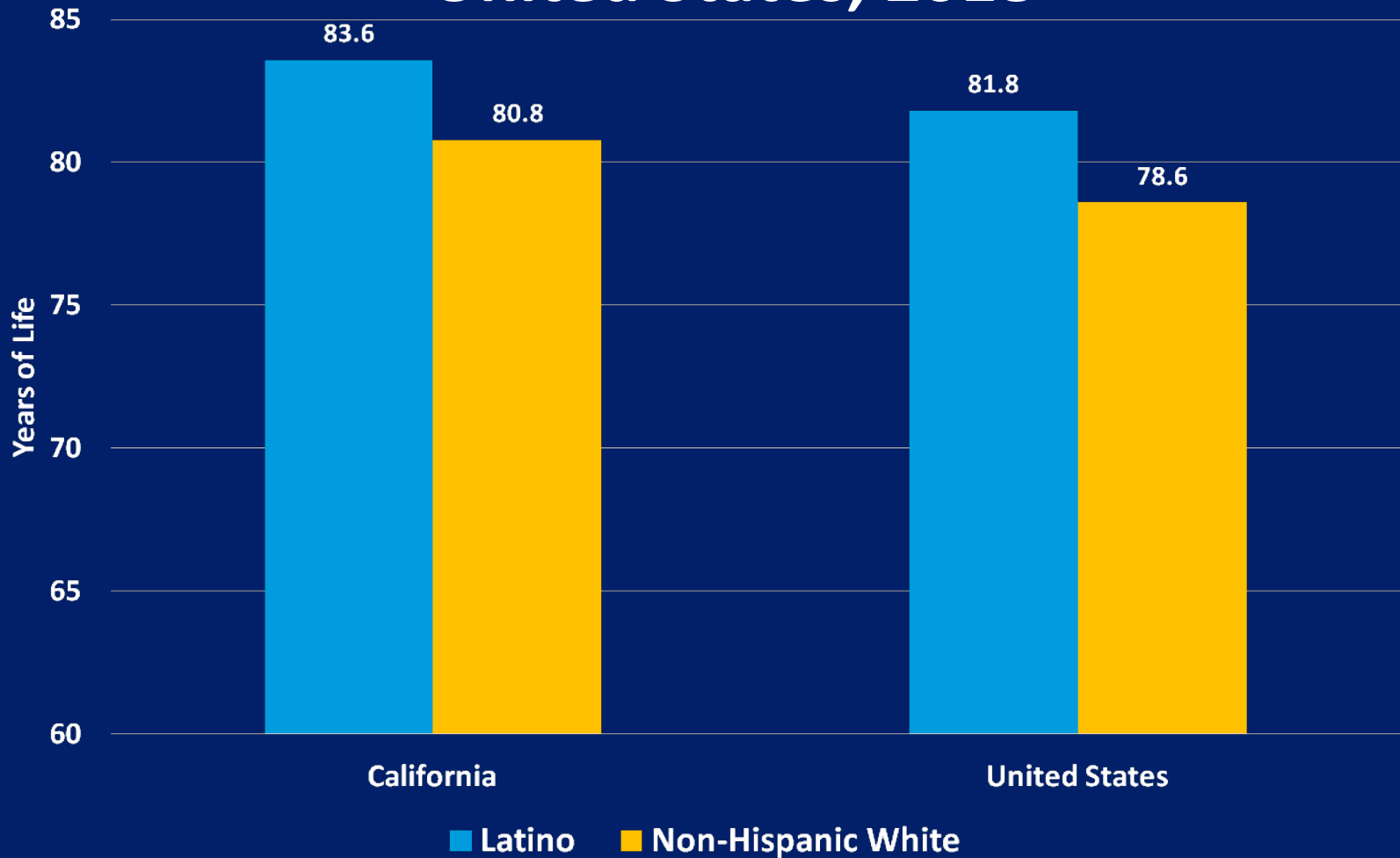
Healthy Babies – Percent Born with Low Birth Weight, Latino and Non-Latino, California and United States 2018



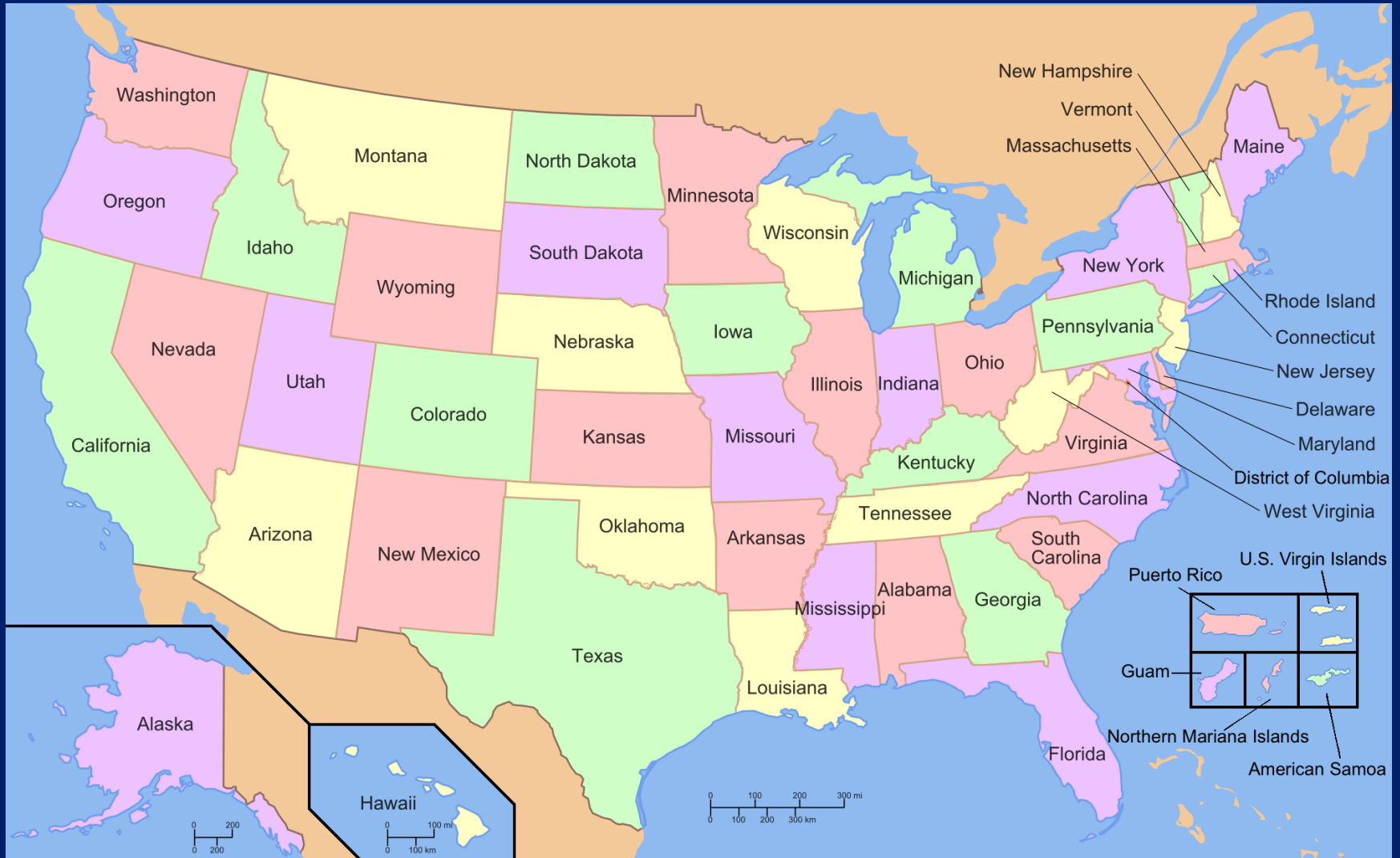

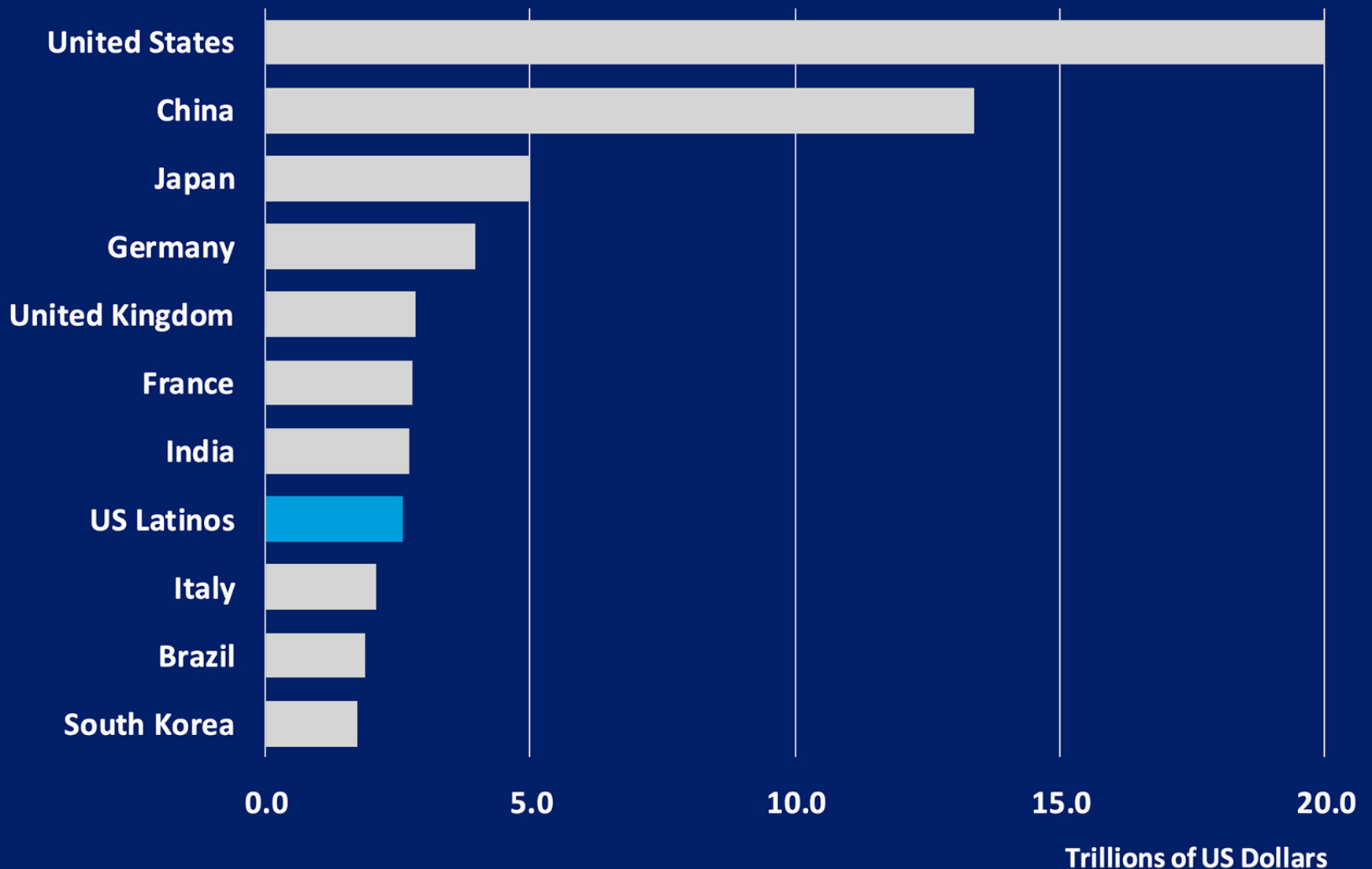

Gross Domestic Product - 2018

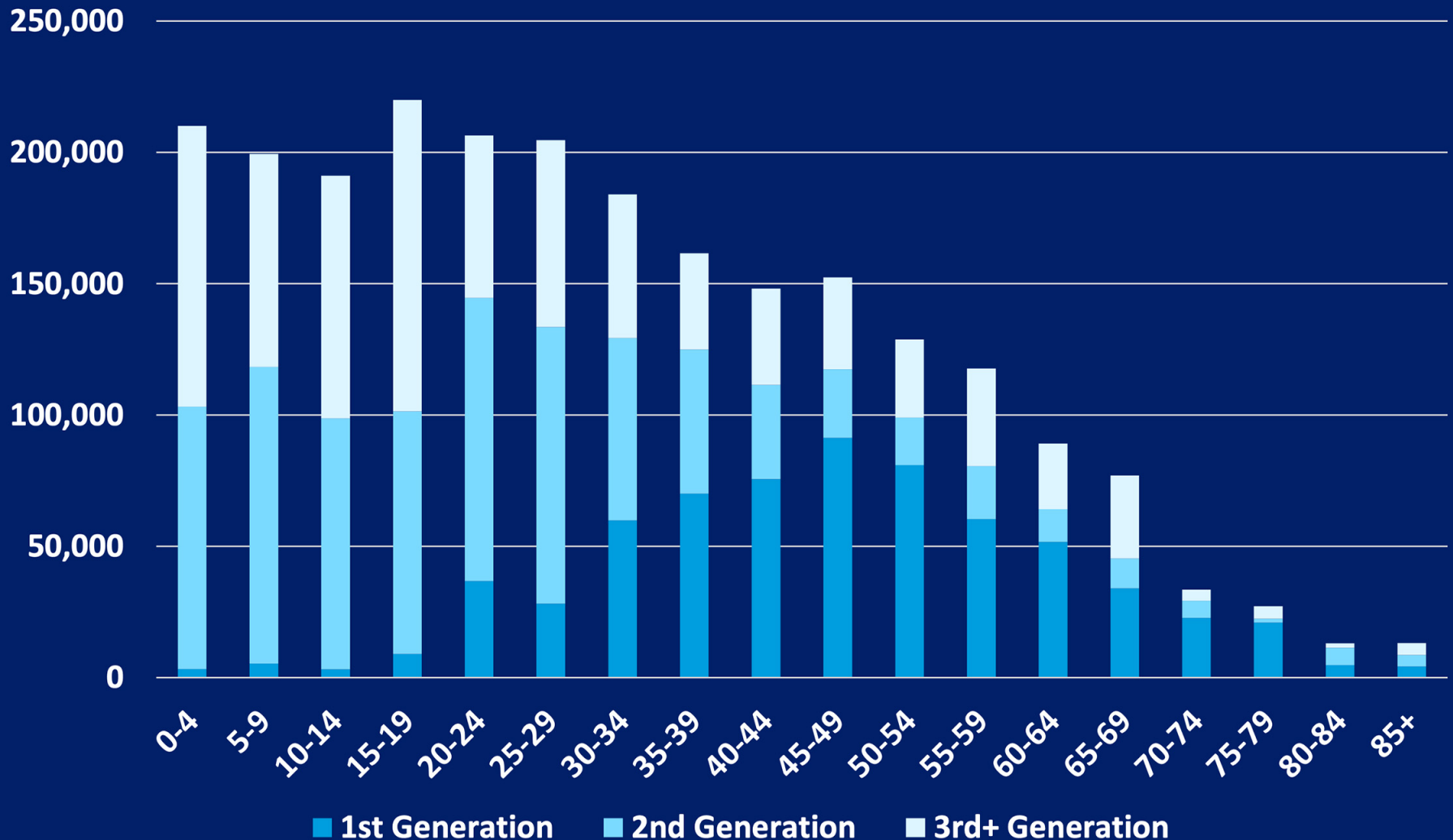
